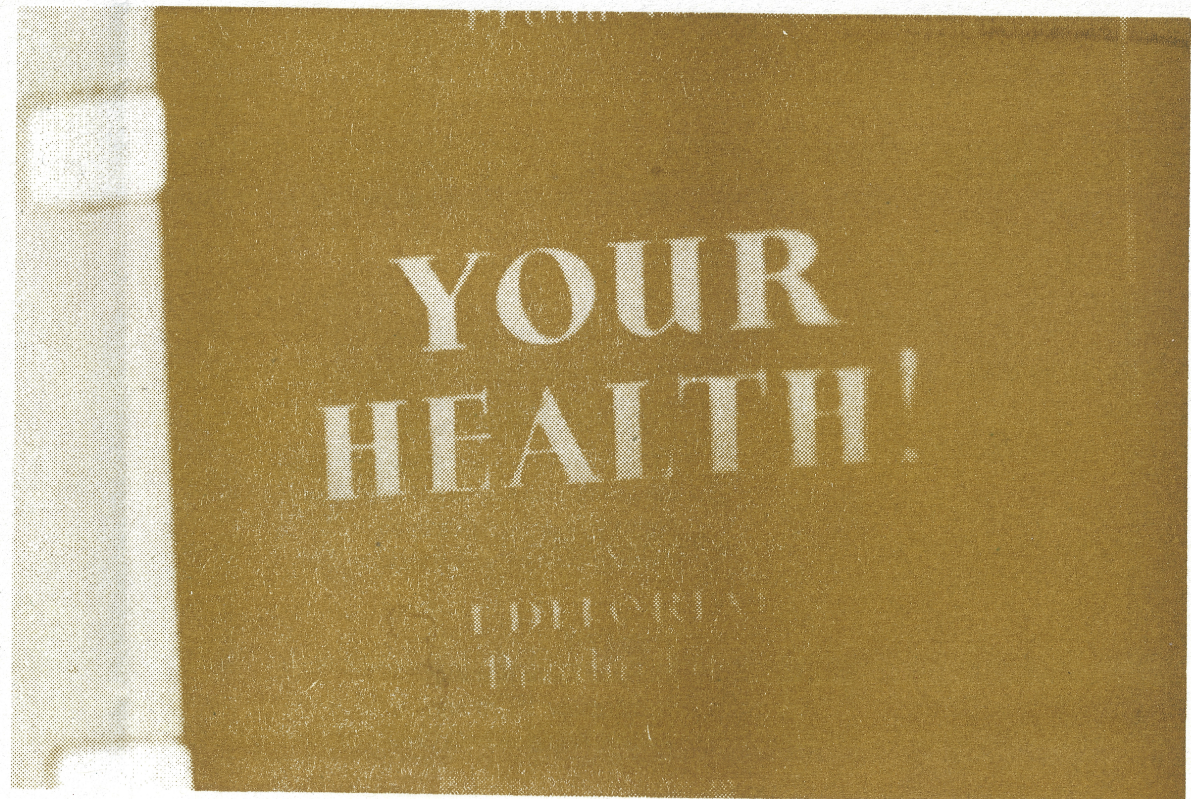
### **Your Health!**
